To the planning team, Please accept this as my third submission to the exhibited plans...

I thoroughly endorse the teams objective to create a mixed use 24/7 precinct. I see economic benefit and security for workers and residents coming from this.

I have two issues and make the following suggestions....

The Blackwattle Bay study planned for 5000 jobs, this study is planning for 23000 jobs, over 20 years. Is it enough? The city will grow by 200000 jobs over this time, Google at White Bay were 10000 jobs alone. The city can only grow to Pyrmont or past Central. Is it enough or should the planning allow for say 40000 jobs? I note that these can easily be accommodated in lowish rise buildings, for example the old wool store at 100 Harris St houses almost 5000 workers.

Correctly in my view Harris St will be strengthened as a transport spine (rather like in tram days), and Union St square strengthened with a metro station. There is great potential in the block of land opposite 100 Harris St, which goes through to Mount St. It is currently rather run down social housing, surrounding and isolating an important heritage building-the CSR managers house.

My submission is that this public land ought to be identified as a new employment hub leveraging the transport connections and its central location and proximity to Union Square. As a matter of design, the topography etc could be used to display the heritage house and with excavation create large footprint campus style commercial spaces. This is consistent with the above point in that it creates the opportunity, subject to market forces for more jobs.

I trust that these submissions can be duly considered and you will find them helpful. Thank you for your work and best wishes for the conclusion of the plan.
