Submission: The Warnervale Airport (Restrictions) Act 1996 is unnecessary. The Act is not necessary as it was enacted to protect the community from jet aircraft operations. This is not possible as the runway has never been sufficiently long enough for jet aircraft operating in Australia. Also the airport is surrounded by terrain which makes it difficult to physically lengthen the runway with wetlands to the south and a major road plus rising terrain to the north. The operations conducted at Warnervale have been doing so for over four decades with up to 300 movements per day so limiting operations to 88 movements per day is extremely restrictive, if not unviable for the users of the airport. It should be remembered that a serviceable airport provides the infrastructure required in emergency situations like the recent bush fires and aeromedical transportation. From my own personal perspective I am a light aircraft pilot and when transiting past Warnervale it provides an added option to me should the weather turn bad or I need to land un-expectantly. Not to mention that in the future I may well wish to operate my own light aircraft out of Warnervale given that I intend to move to the Central Coast. In conclusion I would ask that the Act be removed or at least amended (remove the 88 movement limitation) to allow the airport operations for light aircraft to continue as it has done for over forty years.
