At this stage, Butucarbin's members have availability to attend meetings in the Parramatta/St Leonards area and will also be available for fieldwork in February.

Cultural Connection and Representation

Butucarbin Aboriginal Corporation is a successful not for profit community organisation that was established in 1989 to provide Community Development, Education and Training to organisations and individuals in the Blacktown and Penrith LGA's of Western Sydney. The organisation has won many awards for outstanding service delivery over the past 23 years. The latest being our Executive Officer Jennifer Beale being a finalist in the 2014 NSW Australian of the Year awards.

Due to the changes in funding, for Aboriginal organisations and for Butucarbin to continue the service that they have been providing, the organisation has developed an Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment business. All profits go back into the organisation to provide services to the community. As community workers we believe it is our duty to involve the Aboriginal community of Western Sydney in this work, as it enables the community to learn about cultural heritage and also enables archaeologists to gain different perspectives into Aboriginal Culture.

Butucarbin in itself is a modern example of cultural heritage in that it is a product of the 1970's resettlement program and self-determination policy (see, Aboriginal Community Controlled Organisations). Due to this resettlement policy there are generations of Aboriginal people who have been born in Western Sydney and have been raised in the Mount Druitt Community (which has the highest Aboriginal urban population in Australia) and thus, this is where their connection lies. Ultimately, our cultural connection lies in our community work and assistance to the people of wider Western Sydney.

In conclusion, we also believe it is essential to pass on knowledge from generation to generation. Butucarbin provides cultural knowledge to the wider community through Aboriginal Cultural workshops and community development programs.

John Riley gave an acknowledgement to Country. Then Melissa provided a brief outline of the Mamre Road Precinct rezoning. Attendees were provided with maps of the draft structure plan showing the boundaries of the precinct (the study area) and the proposed zoning.

Alan gave an overview of the aims of the archaeological investigations and fieldwork and provided context around the archaeology of the Cumberland Plain. Attendees were provided with a map showing known existing sites from the Aboriginal Heritage Information Management System (AHIMS) database.

Alan asked for comments regarding the tangible and intangible Aboriginal cultural values within the study area. Extensive discussion followed regarding the existing sites and the importance of the waterways within the study area such as South Creek, Kemps Creek and Ropes Creek; and the potential for lithic resources, such as silcrete, to be present in the area.

Phil drew attention to the significance of the creeks and their importance not only as occupation sites but also for the potential for burials to occur in these riparian zones.

John discussed his previous experience and knowledge of Lot 1 DP 104958 in the north of the study area where a number of artefact sites and a possible scar tree have been identified. He described the north south ridgeline and the area around the dam in the north east corner as areas of particular archaeological sensitivity.

Alan stressed that the rezoning provides interpretive opportunities and encouraged everyone to consider possible locations and ideas for how this could be brought into the development.

Details for the fieldwork next week were discussed including times and meeting places.

7 Indemnity
