Hello. As a resident overlooking and hearing of cathedral square, I want to ensure use is tolerable in terms of noise, light, foot traffic, pathway access through Cathedral square, and - importantly - erection and taking down of facilities. This latter can take two days at both ends, thus extending inconvenience and noise. I note the proposal allows this for the full 7 days for the whole day. Noise is only one issue; dust and detritus, vehicle access and extension of period during which cathedral square is closed to pedestrians has not been covered.

With regard to noise - construction during summer when we have our doors and windows open is horrible. But, the repetitive nature of an ongoing gig can almost drive you crazy.... think the 12 days of Christmas on repeat about every 15 mins for 12 days! And that was only in the evening. It took me some years to persuade the (unfortunately various) companies to ensure speakers faced into the square rather than - I don't know - maybe miscellaneously. Undoubtedly the noise is still quieter within the square than at my place.

I would also like to see that no alcohol be served. C+P Park is already a short cut between drinking places, and is a great place to carouse til all hours, it doesn't need further encouragement. Finally, please ensure lessons learned arr passed from council employee to employee, and to and from organisers

Othrrwise it falls to us to have to complain and then educate. The most recent example was the proposal for a market in the square - I'd love one, but the previous one lasted about a month and disappeared. I contacted the proposal site to mention this, and to ask that no alcohol be served, only to be told it would be held within the Council's guidelines. Ho hum

I understand the desire of government to encourage 'creatives' and to energise the city centre following the impact of Covid on public gatherings. This submissions is therefore less of an objection to the AI Fresco City project as it is a request for modification in relation to Cathedral Square.

As a resident of Boomerang Place, Woolloomooloo my summer rest/sleep is impacted by; a) the 'Lights of Christmas' projections and sound show (ends 11pm each night) for the majority of December evenings, and

b) music from 'Spiegeltent' (ends 11pm or later) for the majority of January evenings, and now

c) proposed 'Al Fresco City' performances each day and evening (10am until 10pm) for 5 nights each week (Wednesday rehearsals and Thursday through Sunday performances) for all of February and March.

The current 'AI Fresco City' plan mentions that an 'amplified sound system' will operate until 10pm each night followed by 'quiet works' until midnight. These 'quiet works' resume at 6am each morning. No definition for 'quiet works' is supplied and Council staff were unable to assist with information when I rang for clarification.

In summary, the 'AI Fresco City' plan will, in conjunction with existing public events, extend the exposure of local residents to late night noise for four continuous months. I am concerned that this will affect the mental and physical health of residents within the 'noise zone'.

Could I therefore make two requests please?

i) that 'quiet works' cease at 11pm rather than midnight each evening so that inadvertent noise (from, for example, cleaning, garbage removal, food and beverage restocking) does not cause unnecessary disturbance.

ii) that Wednesday rehearsals cease at 7pm so that residents have three late evenings free of noise.
