Submission: I am not currently a resident of Bringelly, however I grew up in Kelvin Park Drive, Bringelly and my family continues to live there. I have a vested interest in the future of my family's property and as such I would like to formally submit my strong objection to the rezoning of property, in particular [REDACTED] Bringelly. My family came to this country in 1969 as unskilled migrants from the former Yugoslavia. My grandparents worked their whole lives, paid their taxes and dues and raised their family, who in turn have gone on to raise their own families.

The above-named property that my grandparents purchased in 1989 was possible through hard work, sheer grit and determination, without handouts from anyone or anything. It's seems that the forward planning that Vera and August Najdek (now both deceased) to provide a future for their children cannot be matched by the government, who now believes that it can be all taken away for naught.
