My family, 3 generations of them, have called Bringelly their home since 1989. My siblings and I have grown up here and now my children are growing up here. So you could say we know the area quite well. My grandparents purchased the property [REDACTED] in 1989. This was to give their family a better life different to their own upbringing. If my grandparents were alive now they would be utterly disappointed in the way this government has disrespected those who worked so hard for this land.

We do not agree with the environmental zoning for the protection of the area's flora/fauna. This is clearly for the benefit of the aerotropolis and surrounding development. We do not agree with the flood zoning of the land along Thompson's Creek and South Creek. Thompson Creek has not flooded in over 30 years.

With the government owning over 114 hectares of land behind these properties, what is the significance of deeming privately owned land as flood zone?
