The health implications of living within 3km of a 24/7 airport without a curfew are extraordinary NOISE Shift workers like myself, the Families with small children and the elderly, not to mention our horses, cannot be expected to reside and be able to function in an area that is in the ANEC 20-25 noise contour, according to the WHO guidelines there should be no residential development within 5km of the airport boundary, due to the effects physically and mentally on the residents This is NOT CONDUCIVE to mental and physical wellbeing WATER and AIR QUALITY We are on tank water in this precinct, and there has been a considerable increase in the amount of dust that I have noted on the

At the moment we are battling with dust, are we expected to INGEST and INHALE petrol discharges and fumes once the airport is fully operational. The travel times to and from work has also increased, impacting on our daily lives. This is NOT CONDUCIVE to physical wellbeing and mental health As I mentioned, I am and I have very briefly tried to outline the detrimental effects that living in an area currently undergoing huge infrastructure work to facilitate a 24/7 NO CURFEW Airport in the future has and will have on my Family and myself.
