



1. Select Free Tree from the New menu.




Note: A new free tree application case will open, and the system will auto-generate an "FT-XX" reference number.





3. Select the Bunning store from the drop down-box




Note: Your local Bunnings store will contact you once your tree(s) are ready to be picked up.
