I have heard it called a 'once in a life time experience'. The Government is building an International Airport at Western Sydney and an Aerotropolis Core Mini City.

To accomplish this unprecedented event, the Government must acquire 200-300 five acre home-sites in the Kelvin Park Estate/Bringelly Area.

Progress is progress and residents must accept we have to go, but at what cost? The Government has a history of treating resident poorly when acquiring their home and land.

I have lived in Kelvin Park for 22 years. I live on five acres of well maintained land. My land has a 1/100 year line of limitation which would not be so if the creek at the back of my land (Thompson Creek) was properly maintained.
