I wish to oppose the South Creek Precinct release plan currently on exhibition.

The reserved area of 1,950 hectares of land is unfair to land owners, excessive, and is unnecessary. A lot of this land is not flood affected and is very developable land. The flood line should be pulled back to 1:100 flood line and this would have the majority of acceptance from all residents, as residents bought property with this knowledge.

We also don't want restrictive Environmental Zones, limiting new development ideas and concepts - the very image of the Aerotropolis throughout the world is to be a state of the art engine room that shows the whole experience of a new destination to Western Sydney, to place restrictive environmental zoning within this area, would be counterproductive.

Increasing the green zone to 1,950 hectares, would promote more food source for attracting bird and bat habitat, and animals which could have serious implications for a new airport only a few kilometres away. Green space is important, but must be sensibly planned taking into account all considerations including safety.

There are plenty of green spaces already around the area, with the Cumberland woodplains, open playing fields at Narellan and Harrington Park. Working with all councils from Hawkesbury to Narellan the entirety of the South Creek 70 kms within the 1:100 flood zone, would give ample green space.
