We just learnt from our very distressed parents that the piece of land they called home for the past [REDACTED] now being acquired to accommodate the Aerotropolis project and will have to move.

Not only are they distraught, but my husband and myself are as well. I have lived on my parent's property for [REDACTED] years, my husband for [REDACTED] years together with our two children aged [REDACTED]. We opted to stay with our parents as we wanted to help them especially in their old age. Our mother had a heart attack and our father a back operation and although they are both mobile at this stage we help each other. My husband and I have substantive positions and not have to worry about the safety for our children as our parents transport them to school and daycare, and look after them during the school holidays. We help maintain the property.

We missed our opportunity of buying a home before prices escalated as a piece of Kemps Creek property where we live was eventually going to be ours. What do we do now? We cannot afford to buy anything around here; it means we will have to move to the country or interstate. We were a happy family with no worries, but now its sleepless nights, both on high blood pressure medication and our future destroyed! Moving from here will mean separation from our family, loss of jobs which will be hard to replace and trying to explain to our upset children that they will have to leave their nanna and pa. We have two little ones asking if they will have to leave school, sporting and swimming sessions and leave their friends. We do not have the heart to tell them what the future lies and shed silent tears for them. They are used to open spaces where they can run free with their animals, kick balls without upsetting neighbours and ride their bikes. The thought of us having to move onto a small house block that you cannot swing a cat in is totally destroying us.

We can only hope that the governing bodies, whoever they may be, find heart and compensate the unfortunate land owners who have had their land rezoned from urban to non urban by offering them the same market value they would have been offered if their land stayed urban/light industry. Maybe then we may have a chance of staying together as a family and moving to another property.
