Submission: In regards to the Draft Cumberland Plan I would like to draw the committee/ panel to seriously consider some vacant land at [REDACTED] Doonside. This to either buy or place more restrictions on the owner and council reserves neighbouring the land. The reasons being: There is E2 land of just under 1ha and just over 2ha R2 (all up 3ha) with Cumberland Plain Woodlands and other flora and fauna. The owner Statewide purchased this site off the State Education department as it was surplus land in 2015. They have tried now two DA's to submit for 30 two story houses. The DA lodged in 2016 was rejected for a number of reasons (mainly environmental) in 2019 by the Land and Environmental court. It is back in the Land and Environmental court. As a resident next door to this land for a number of years we believe this land should not be developed. If it does there will be hundreds of established trees will go and the other ecosystem/ Cumberland Woodlands wood be at further risk of destruction. I have been an active advocate for this land collecting hundreds of petitions, objections and generally speak for the locals who do not want the development that has gone through Blacktown council and now onto the Land and Environmental Court (AGAIN).
