Submission: Hi I'd like to emphasise I believe you should fully preserve the existing bush land between Jordan springs and Ropes crossing I note your plan indicated the Wianamatta reserve is preserved however when you utilise the map functions the existing vegetation outside of the reserve is not protected under the plan It is a beautiful piece of land that provides not only space for many native animals and endangered cumberland plains vegetation, it's one of the last remaining larger bits of bush in the western Sydney area especially around here In addition the walking trail between sites is now part of the great western Sydney walk and is a valuable leisure space for families and residents in the local adjacent suburbs It will be a travesty if you don't protect this corridor from further development In addition broadly speaking please start building up to preserve land
