Submission: I have read many of the sub-plans, Q&A's, spatial plan and watched the introductory video. The Plan area is enormous, and obviously can't be everything to all people. However, despite some efforts it reads as a developers dream. The linking corridors are small, the koala habitat inadequate, freeways have right of way thru natural areas, it is already highly urbanised in some areas and the projected population is significant. This provides me with little confidence that there will be sufficient appropriate space, protection, funding and commitment to protect the rightful place of a rapidly reducing natural environment. The Plan operates largely on off-sets and they just don't work. The offset locations are always inferior to the areas lost to development. We are talking today of developments being locked in for the decades in the future, rather like Rio Tinto and the blowing up of the Juukan shelters and the ready acceptance to destruct other Aboriginal sites. Basically I object to the Plan on so many fronts.
