Re. The Draft Cumberland Plain Conservation

I wish to express my objection to the Draft Cumberland Plain Conservation Plan

Massive urbanisation with its increased cars and dogs will put this fragile chlamydia- free population of koalas in danger.

The Plan fails to set aside enough land to properly protect the largest chlamydia-free koala population in N.S.W.

The Plan's proposed construction of 120 km of Koala exclusion fencing will isolate and fragment the Koala colonies, as the Plan inadequately protects the east-west movement corridors recommended in the Chief Scientist Koala Report.

The plan only commits to the creation of the Georges River Koala Reserve. Two other reserves, the Gulguer and the Confluence are still under investigation for feasibility and will possibly only be secured by 2040.

I have heard of a male koala that has travelled from Kurrajong to Glenbrook in the Blue Mountains and believe the corridors are of the utmost importance and should be maintained.

I have visited The Cumberland Plains Woodland with my local plant group and there are plant species that are special to this area and should be maintained. It would seem that 16% of what woodland that is left will be impacted by proposed development.

Large amounts of rural land will be classified as 'urban capable' increasing population, cars and pollution causing an extra threat to native wildlife.
