Submission to the Pyrmont Peninsula Place Strategy Implementation Plan

It is concerning that the degree of community consultation re the Pyrmont Peninsula Place Strategy appears to be uni-directional in so far as it lacks the rigour of genuine consultation ahead of planning announcements.

The Pyrmont community group, Friends of Pyrmont Community Centre, has many genuine concerns about the PPPS, especially as it applies to four areas:

- Maybanke Recreation Centre
- Union Square
- · Threats to public and affordable housing
- Blackwattle Bay.

For many years the Pyrmont community has been focused on enhancing facilities and activities that bring the community closer together. These include the welcoming and inclusion of residents from varied cultures and walks of life whilst encouraging all community members to provide feedback on proposals affecting the greater Pyrmont/Ultimo peninsula.

Pyrmont residents have developed a community that merges public housing tenants together with upmarket apartment dwellers. Any proposal that replaces any housing with terraced gardens and paths insults the community and undermines the social cohesion of which NSW should be proud.

All proposals for development on the Pyrmont peninsula must allow for genuine community consultation and feedback. This cannot simply be a "tick the box" exercise but must consider the real concerns and innovative ideas of community members who live and work here, and whose lives will be affected.

I respectfully seek your diligent perusal of the proposal from Friends of Pyrmont Community Centre and your sincere respect for its opinions through an enhanced community engagement model.
