I am writing to you as a local community group leader in regards to the Aerotropolis Precinct Plan that was released yesterday. The lack of integration of the Aerotropolis Precinct with the adjoining precincts has been identified as major cause for concern for residents in the community.

The use of open space/parkland in non-flood affected areas as barriers to isolate the Aerotropolis from adjoining precincts needs to be removed and rectified immediately. There already is sufficient open space/parkland in the vicinity.

Bringelly Road being such a major arterial road can accomodate much more significant development. Not using the Bringelly Road upgrade to its full potential is a waste of taxpayer money.

Many of the identified roads in the plan into the Aerotropolis Core precinct from Bringelly road need to be widened. A collector road with one lane each way into the heart of new city is not sufficient. It will create a bottle neck at Bringelly Road and the adjacent Jersey Road. A minimum of two lanes each direction needs to be implemented with an additional third lane for parking.

This needs to be rectified immediately to avoid potential disaster.
