We were told that South Creek Environmental & Recreational zone will not be acquired under Just Terms but I cannot understand this as this is a RECREATIONAL zone,

Open space is any open piece of land that is undeveloped (has no buildings or other built structures) and is accessible to the public. Open space can include: • Green space (land that is partly or completely covered with grass, trees, shrubs, or other vegetation). Green space includes parks, community gardens, and cemeteries. • Schoolyards • Playgrounds • Public seating areas • Public plazas • Vacant lots

Open space provides recreational areas for residents and helps to enhance the beauty and environmental quality of neighbourhoods. But with this broad range of recreational sites comes an equally broad range of environmental issues.
