Submission: 1. The change in boundary that goes beyond Trahairs Rd changes the proposal far beyond what the community was led to understand. Trahairs Rd should remain as the northern boundary of the SAP. 2. 'Unavoidable tree removals': in this locality, which has only around 1% of native vegetation remaining, every tree is crucial. No tree should be cut down, so planning should take this into account. Tree cover will also assist with local concerns of Brucedale residents about the visual impact of the SAP development. Not only should every existing tree be conserved, an extensive native tree planting program should be established around the boundaries of the SAP. 3. Wagga LGA already has a biodiversity problem. Every effort must be made to not only conserve all biodiversity aspects of the SAP, there should be a biodiversity extension plan. 4. Long-neck turtles live in this area, yet their ranging habits do not appear to be accounted for in the draft. This is a serious oversight.
